Dear Sir

I would not wish to in-
trude on your time, which must be contin-
ually engaged. But in sorrow, & perplexity,
address you as a Christian Lady to ask
for advice, direction, & influence. Having
learned that in the North many benev-
olent Societies have been formed to contri-
bute, to, or relieve the necessities of the Poor
in the South I thought I would apply
to some person of intelligence & influence
to enquire if they knew such to be the
case, and beg their interest in my family.

And believing your principles in a
Christian, & political sense, to be in uni-
son, with my own. My mind suggested
an application to You. I have very poor
health, & a state of mind, "unsupported by
Christian hope, would with my pecuniary
difficulties unfit me for any relation in
life. I have five children who look to me

for support, & owing to my principles I
cannot ask for, or expect much sympathy.
The approaching winter presents a dark
prospect before us. Living in the Country with
no crop & no means of support which I
could see for them. We have a small
plan, but were so unfortunate as to lose
our only Horse, in the Spring & have
not been able to obtain any sort of
since I have struggled thro' the Summer.
But unless Providence opens a way by which
we can get some employment, which will
at least supply us with bread - God alone
knows what is to become of us this Winter.
During the late War I made many acquain-
-ances of influence & sterling worth. But
most of these are numbered among the
dead - Others I should not fail to ask
friends in my need. Sometimes you have
seen a great deal of want - Gen Howard
since the commencement of the late War
? Can you feel for me in my need as a Christian
& tho' a Stranger I may add friend - If you

Will you endeavor to interest sympathizing -
friends in me, & my Children, and try to get
us some help before the Winter. As one of
Gods Stewards I address you. Hoping you -
will try to do something for me. My Sister
Mrs Waring Ball of Fairfax Va will hand you
this by my especial request in consequence of
my inability to see you on this business in
person which I desired very much indeed.
