My Dear Sir;

Your letter of 21st inst. is received with bank stock enclosed as stated, \$1000. face value Quassaick Bank and \$500. face value Highland Bank.

I find by my books that the Highland stock cost you 1.³⁰ and accrued interest on May 5th; you dft bring \$667.⁰⁵, and the charges on the other side bring, 10 shares \$50 each @ 1.²⁰ \$650.

Interest Jan^y 1st to May 5th. 7% on 500. 12.15

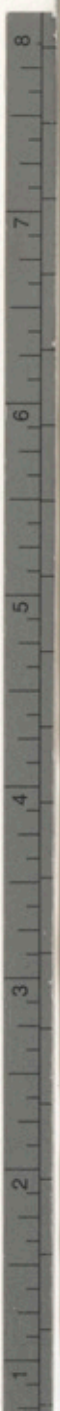
Cash returned 4.90
