

Some eighteen months since I was afflicted with a pimple upon my upper lip; thinking nothing of it until it became so angry, and enlarged as to excite my uneasiness, I sought local medical advice, but without avail.

Cure. I think my articulation will be
considerably affected.

I became a cripple in
1860 from inflammatory rheumatism,
and have been compelled to use a crutch
ever since. I am very poor, have been
engaged in teaching since I became a
cripple, and I fear that I will be unable
to follow my avocation if my articulation
is very seriously affected. The place upon
which I am now living is owned by
parties now residing in Indiana.

They proposed selling it very soon, giving
me the refusal of it for \$500. The place

is very cheap at the price, and I am anxious to brood the purchaser. Several of our old classmates have contributed to the purchase, or the means thereof amounting in all to some \$350.


