THE popular success which greeted this resort and Home at the time of its start has attended it during its rapid growth. Situated on those famous points of the sportsman, Barnegat Bay and Cedar Creek, it possesses all the pleasures of retirement, while its proximity by rail to the busier resorts make accessible those seaside cities that skirt the New Jersey Coast. 4. The establishment of an Office, from which is issued the Monthly Army and Navy Magazine-The Public Service Review.
5. The erection and completion of several handsome cottages.
6. The opening of a handsome and well-equipped Post Office, (three mails daily each way), and Western Union telegraphic communication with the World.
7. Continued progress on the Avenues and Boulevards, about 13 miles of which are now cut out.
8. The establishment and opening of the Law Offices (at the Park) of Larner and Bruen, prominent Attorneys and Counsellors,
9. The organization and incorporation of a Stock Company (with General Frank Wheaton, U. S. Army,-Colonel P. T. Swaine, U. S. Army,-Colonel Leslie Smith. U. S. Army,-Captain Henry Wagner, U. S. Army,-Surgeon Frederick W. Elbrey, U. S. Army,-Captain George W. Evans, U. S. Army,-William L. Bruen, Washington, D. C.,-J. Bodine, Jersey City, N. J., and John B. Larner Washington, D. C. as Incorporators) to at once erect a $\$ 50,000$ Hotel to cover one Block of the Park. This Hotel will be tastefully furnished and equipped, and under the superintendence of a first-class and experienced Caterer. A Company to construct a Railway to the Beach, and a Casino on the Bay-front is also incorporated.
