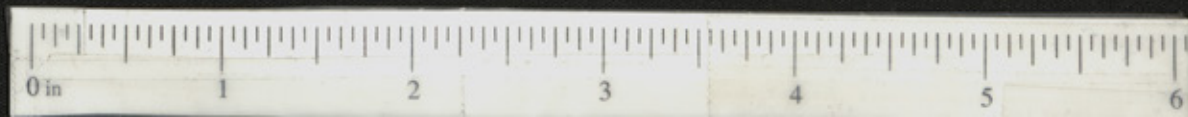

June 28 to July 9.

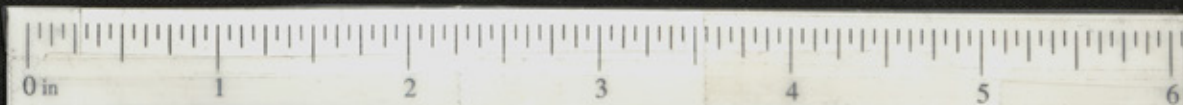

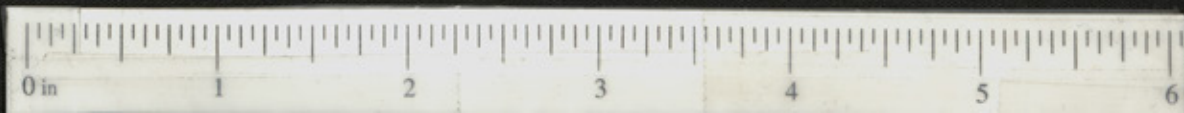

My dear General

I understand that General Officers have been called upon to make further recommendations for "brevets" for indian service. If you think my services at Clearwater, or during the Nez Percé war, were worthy of mention it would be a gratification to me to receive, upon your recommendation, a Brevet of Colonel. Gen. Jeff. C. Davis recommended me for the brevet of Lieut Colonel for the Mexican War.

My actual rank will never be higher than at present held, retirement for age taking me out of active service in seven years. The brevet can do me no particular good but will be a record for my children, for which purpose it is pain-
