### IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES.

JANUARY 27, 1890.

Mr. ALLEN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Military Affairs.

# TT

To amend an act approved March third, eighteen hundred and eighty-one, for the relief of citizens of Montana who served with the United States troops in the war with the Nez Perce Indians, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That an act entitled "An act for the relief of citizens of Mon-3 tana who served with the United States troops in the war 4 5 with the Nez Perces, and for the relief of the heirs of such 6 as were killed in such service," and approved March third, eighteen hundred and eighty one, be amended so as to read 7 as follows: 8

That each volunteer who joined the forces of the United 9 States, in the Territories of Montana, Washington, and Idaho, 10 11 during the war with the Nez Perce Indians, shall be paid one dollar per day during the term of such service. from the time 12



1 SEC. 2. That all persons who were wounded or disabled 2 in such service, and the heirs of all who were killed in such 3 service, shall be entitled to all the benefits of the pension 4 laws, in the same manner and to the same extent as if they 5 had been duly mustered into the regular or volunteer forces 6 of the United States, said benefits to date from March third, 7 eighteen hundred and eighty-one.

SEC. 3. That all horses and arms lost in such service shall be paid for at their actual value, to be duly ascertained 2 by the Secretary of War : Provided, That no payment shall 3 be made for such losses except upon the statement of the 4 commanding officer of the United States troops, or such other 5 officer of the Regular Army as might be in control of the 6 volunteers at the time of such loss, and such other proofs as 7 may be required by the Secretary of War, to establish the 8 fact that such losses were made in the service of the United 9 States. 10

Marcus P.Miller and that several field orders were given him by you and finally an order for him and his Compnay with others to march to the relief of Colonels Perry and Whipple, at Cottenwood, Idaho Terr., and finally that you ordered their discharge at Lewiston, I.T., their services being no longer required.

If you have recollection or memoranda of these and other facts connected with this service and are willing to do so, I would be pleased if you would communicate with me upon the subject. I trust I am asking nothing beyond the limits of propriety in making this request.




