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

I agree with you fully that you will have more peace of mind, probably earn as much money and be saved from one of the most difficult and complicated pieces of work in connection with the Indian Bureau or Department of the Interior now before it by seeking for yourself or through friends an appointment upon the Dawes Indian Commission. I have several times been in that territory and find it thoroughly settled by whites without laws, police, etc. liquor and beer are sold every where, roads are fenced off, a state of affairs exist which it would be very difficult to adjust especially as towns and cities including many brick buildings have been erected at many points on lands leased in perpecuity from the Indians. I fear some members of the commission (not Mr. Dawes) have selfish motives and not really the interests of the government or Indians at heart. I thought of this because your name was mentioned in the territory and you would be hailed with delight as a check upon bad men. However, I personally feel that you are freer and better off Yours affections telef, engaged as you are.




