We herewith inclose cancellation of original water right issued to Edward E. Elliott, which it is necessary for you to sign and acknowledge before a Notary before water rights will be issued to C. B. Alexander, to whom you have deeded the W. $1 / 2$ of the S. - . W. 1/4 of Section 7-31-29, containing 82.79 acres, which said deed to Alexander is held in escrow by the Bank of pakersfield pending the issuance of this water right and the payment of certain monies due therefor.

We also inclose copy of a letter addressed to C. B. Alexander by Km . S. Tevis, President of the East Side Canal Co., stating that he will issue the new water rights on the conditions specified in the water right herewith inclosed, the difference being that in the new water right the parties to whom the water right is issued agree to pay 75 e per cubic foot instead of $\$ 1.50$ per acre, as specified in the original contract. The amount of water to be delivered is theoritically the same, and the difference if any, is in favor of the new water right, which the Attomeys for Alexander and our Attomey accept and consider it preferrable to the old contract. Of course if Mr. Deacon fulfills the contract between you and himself, it is immaterial to you as to the water rights; at the same time the new water rights are more desirable in every respect than the old.

We also send the contract in duplicate between the Bast Side Canal Co., and Oliver 0. Howard for water right to the W. $1 / 2$ of the S. B. $1 / 4$ and E. $1 / 2$ of the S. W. $1 / 4$ of Section 7. Township 31 S., R. 29 E., containing 165.30 acres, both of which you will please sim and have acknowledged before a Notary Public, and return the same direct to this office.

In executing the cancellation of water right and the contract wi th the East Side Canal Co., (neither of which is necessary to be signed by your wife) the same should be acknowledged before a Notary Public, using the form herewith inclosed, and after the Notary has affixed his certificate of acknowledgment, there should then be annexed to both the contract and the can-

cellation of water right the certificate of the County Clerk of the County in which the Notary acts, setting forth that such Notary at the time of taking such acknowledgement was authorized to take the same, and that he was a Notary duly commissioned and sworn, and that the Clerk was acquainted with his hand writing and believed that the signature to the Mora's certificate was genuine.

After you have executed both of these papers, you will please forward to this office, as stated before, the contract between the East Side Canal Co., and yourself for the new water right, and forward the cancellation of water right, after you have executed the same, to Frederick Huntzicker, at Neillsville, Clark County; Wisconsin, for his signature. It would be well for you to register this document and place an immediate delivery stamp on the envelope before forwarding it to Mr. Huntzicker at his address, to insure its prompt delivery. Mr. Wm. Brennan, who is to sign the cancellation, could not be here today, but will sigh the same on its return to us by Mr. Huntzicker.

The County Clerk in certifying to the acknowledgment of the Notary to the deed that you sent to us, did not fill out his blank as to the female character of the Notary, and did not even specify the County in which she was authorized to act. If you will inspect these certificates yourself you will see what we refer to. We fear that after all we will have to return the deed to you to have these Notarial and Clerk's certificates changed.

In all these matters we have consulted wi th our Attomey, as well as the Attorney for C. B. Alexander, and are satisfied that everything is perfectly straight, and we trust that you will hasten the return of the papers.

It would be well for you to forward the copy of the Tevis letter to Alexander to Mr. Huntzicker.
