

Dear General:

I have your letter of the 12th inst.enclosing Nickel Plate and West Shore annuals. I shall mail them back to you from New York. I wish I might meet you somewhere while I am down east. I shall probably be in New York at the St.Denis Hotel about two days and at The Hamilton in Washington after that. You spoke of going to Gettysburg and NewxXoxxxx Washington, so I have thought it possible that you might be down that way before I leave Washington.

I called on Dr. Pearsons a few days ago and he again talked to me about Mr. Fairchild. He stated that Mr. Fairchild is having articles printed in different periodicals through the east; trying to injure President Frost, of Berea. These articles are sent to Dr. Pearsons. Dr. Pearsons says that President Frost cannot be in the least affected by Mr. Fairchild; that Frost has a strong backing of trustees and others who are able business men and have full confidence in Frost; that Frost will within a few months have raised another \$150,000 for endowment, and that the raising of this amount will help us. Dr. Pearsons said that Fairchild is not doing us any good at all, and then placing his finger on his forehead

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between his eyes, said, "and every move Fairchild makes hits Cumberland Gap squarely between the eyes!

You will remember that when I saw you last I told you that
Mr.Fairchild seemed to be working with the one object in view,
namely, to get himself reinstated at Berea. I have felt all along
that he has not been helping us at all. The Palmer House meeting,
which led to so much embarrassment, was Mr.Fairchild's project.
When I first told him about Dr.Leland, he insisted at once on having Dr.Leland's matter presented to the public through a banquet.
I advised against it and tried to prevent it. It was my intention
to say nothing in public about Dr.Leland's matter, until it was
in definite form.
