The enrollment of male students at the 104 colleges under discussion is but little short of 39,000, or over 5,000 more than reported last year; and fully 50 per cent of this number, or 19,564, were enrolled in the military departments--sufficient to form over 37 regiments of infantry. Fifty-six institutions report a gain in their military departments. These figures may possibly indicate the popularity of the military feature and its beneficial influence upon these colleges. The following table, compiled from previous reports, shows their development for the past 5 years:
