A generous servant of his *alma mater*, he was a director and chairman of the Alumni Fund from 1937 to 1940 and among his gifts to the College have been valuable papers relating to the Bowdoin family. An outstanding member of the Board of Overseers, he served as its President from 1965 to 1969. The College owes a considerable debt to him for his careful scrutiny of its financial affairs. A man of strength and acumen, he has always taken time in a busy career to work for the College and its students.
