

**ALFRED BENNETT HARBAGE**, one of the greatest American Shakespearean scholars of the present time, former Cabot Professor of English Literature at Harvard, and mentor to countless students of Elizabethan drama. A native of Philadelphia and a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, he became Professor of English and Chairman of the Graduate Faculty there before serving with equal distinction at Columbia and Harvard. The General Editor of the Pelican edition of Shakespeare's plays, he is the author of influential works on Shakespeare's audience, Shakespeare and morality, and Shakespeare and the rival traditions. One of the few Americans to give the annual Shakespeare lecture of the British Academy, he has also been Alexander Lecturer at the University of Toronto. A worthy successor of Ashley Thorndike and Oscar Campbell at Columbia, and of George Lyman Kittredge at Harvard, he has placed all teachers and students of Shakespeare deeply in his debt. No contemporary writer on Elizabethan drama is more highly respected. A great literary scholar, an inspirational teacher, a penetrating critic, he exemplifies the best in the American academic tradition.

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
