

ORREN CHALMER HORMELL of the Bowdoin Faculty, graduate of Indiana University, Master of Arts and Doctor of Philosophy of Harvard, teacher at Bowdoin for forty years, DeAlva Stanwood Alexander Professor of Government since 1927; visiting lecturer in government at Harvard, Illinois, Michigan, and Syracuse Universities; founder of Bowdoin's Bureau of Municipal Research, whose brochures on public administration have won national fame; early advocate of the town manager system and adviser on town and city charters all over New England, to whom probably as much as to any other single man is due the fact that Maine has more town managers to its credit than has any other state of her size and population; leader in this important municipal reform which has spread all over the country; beloved teacher, absent-minded and high-minded professor, one of the country's foremost scholars in the field of municipal research.
