

JOHN KNIGHT MOULTON, M.A. of the College in 1962, mathematician and outstanding teacher. A member of Bowdoin's first class of graduate alumni, you have returned as a member of the Faculty of the NSF Summer Institute of the College in 1966 and 1969. Long a devoted teacher at the secondary level, you were selected as the Massachusetts Teacher of the Year in 1967 and at the same time honored as one of the top five secondary school teachers in the country. In 1968 you returned to Maine as Assistant Professor of Mathematics at Gorham State College. Your contributions to your field have been numerous. A Boston area Chairman of the School Mathematics Study Group Committee, you helped to develop and teach an experimental mathematics program; you were a co-founder of the Association of Advanced Placement Mathematics Teachers and co-author of two works dealing with mathematical education. You have also applied your mathematical knowledge to the problems of population trends and future land use in Maine. In a career of service to education, you have demonstrated that you understand well the obligations which accompany the privileges and dignities of your degree. Quiet and devoted leadership deserves no less a reward.
