

**OLIN SEWALL PETTINGILL, JR.**, of the Class of 1930, noted ornithologist, a Bowdoin son. Native habitat, Maine; winters in nearby Wayne; usually found in flight; migration occurs from mid-North America to the Falkland Islands; customarily observed behind binoculars, a color-camera, or a writer's desk; frequents lecture halls and college classrooms; eagerly anticipated in all areas and all activities; a rare prototype displaying a happy blend of excellent scientific training, original creative skill, and an intuitive sense of beauty. Had John James Audubon lived a century later, his tools would have been those of the man we honor today.
