

WILLARD GORDON WYMAN, of the Class of 1920, holder of a Certificate of Honor granted that year, Major General of the United States Army; born in Augusta, son of a well-known Maine family; graduate of West Point in the Class of 1919; distinguished professional soldier both in peace and in war, with decorations for work in both Asiatic and European theaters; associated with Roy Chapman Andres in Mongolian problems of geography and ethnology; mentioned in General Eisenhower's memoirs as one of his younger and promising colleagues; decorated many times by our own country and by our allies for bravery and leadership; officer whose high rank is equaled by his ability, scholarship, and integrity; a representative of our armed forces on whom today as always so much depends.
