Fluent in four European languages, she left this position in 1945 in order to serve her country as a member of the State Department Foreign Service. As cultural affairs officer in the United States embassies in Austria, Switzerland, the Netherlands, and the United Kingdom, she served with distinction wherever she found herself and made countless friends for her country. She understands the American experience well and has served us faithfully in communicating it to other nations. Devoted to the principle of international understanding, she embodies that idea of public service which it is education's duty to foster.
