Frank Arthur Brown, Jr., Bowdoin graduate *cum laude* of the Class of 1929, earned his A.M. and Ph.D. degrees in Zoology from Harvard University before embarking on a long and active career as biologist and teacher. A probing researcher in invertebrate zoology, he pioneered in the elucidation of biological rhythms. Modern science is in his debt. His teaching inspired students at the Marine Biological Laboratory at Woods Hole and at Northwestern University, and helped to launch a new generation of biologists. In 1979 Bowdoin was honored to give him its Distinguished Educator Award. Today we recognize him once again for his outstanding contributions to education and to research.
