

**HARLAN FISKE STONE**, graduate of Amherst in the Class of 1894, Chief Justice of the United States; for a dozen years Dean of the Law School of Columbia University, then for some time in the firm of Sullivan and Cromwell, of New York City, well known to us at Bowdoin; Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, 1924-1941; Chief Justice since 1941, twelfth in that famous line that began with John Jay and wherein Bowdoin's Melville Weston Fuller, the orator fifty years ago, was eighth; in turbulent days when, like all other institutions, the law is restless, guiding with wisdom and discretion the proceedings of that great court which is still the bulwark of American liberty; chief of one of the three great agencies of the Republic on whose independence our liberties rest.
