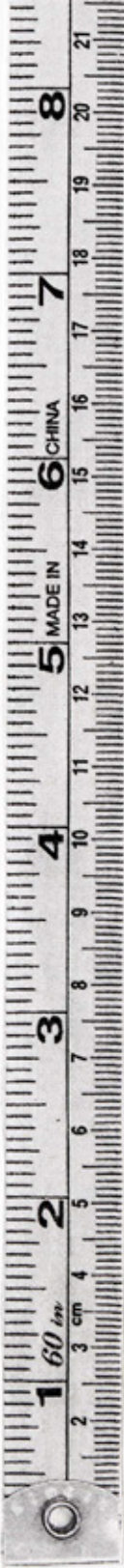
I am sorry it is not convenient
