

Monday A.M. June 22<sup>d</sup> 1863.

Dear John -

I received your letter day before yesterday and was surprised that you had not heard from me. I wrote you at Falmouth - one of Ewing as you said and enclosed an invitation from Mr. Peterson on behalf of his scholars for you to accompany them on an excursion down the Bay. You would have enjoyed it if you had been here. I hope you will receive it for it was a pleasure - nothing. Besides of course all my letters contain highly important information, as well as being deeply interesting! I was glad you wrote to let us know when you are free of all the panics we have seen since the last one crowded all - People believed everything. It cannot have been much worse in Washington itself - Perhaps you are with the boys. I shall mail a letter to them with this one to-night -. Did you see Lewis Braxton at the Metropolitan in Washington the day before you wrote -
