My dear Sarah.

The order that  
I have sent to all orders  
sent all orders, and  
we shall arrive in the  
City of Portland on the  
15<sup>th</sup> or 20<sup>th</sup> inst. I want  
very soon (the (red  
one) kept up and get  
in good condition  
as possible for me to  
use on our way home.  
I would like to have my  
carriage home and  
all in first rate shape  
or I shall have to hire  
instead of using my own

I shall bring home  
one or two more good  
horses and saddles  
bridles, Saddle Cloth  
14 x 12 for numerous  
& mentions and I think  
a Wolf Pack.

We will make  
a visit to Mrs Huttons  
and any where else you  
want to go, so you see  
the importance of my  
trains being in good  
order. I shall bring  
home my Higger who  
will always take care  
of my things hereafter.  
It will cost nothing to  
take him as far as  
the Regiment goes  
viz - to Portland.  
I suppose we will  
have to stay in Portland

a week or two.  
I expect Choleby staying  
to day. It is too bad  
on his account for  
he has bought an  
entire new uniform  
and will not stay more  
than a week or two  
in service. He will  
receive just about  
enough to pay for his  
new uniform -  
But it will be a  
fine thing for him  
to say he was commissioned  
in the service and  
served till end of War  
I don't know whether  
I am glad or not - but if  
there was a Foreign  
War, I would enlist  
tomorrow morning  
as a private if I could it
