months. I cannot realize that you
are surrounded with so many nice
things, while everything is so beautiful here.
Tom has been very good about writing
and we have had several letters
since we came. Write just as
often as you can, the carrier's knock
is such a welcome sound in the

morning. John has gone out to seek
an barn manager so far to get
along very comfortably without the
return, as there seems to be one
end of servants in the house, both
white and black. Give a great
deal of love to all at home from
us both, and accept ours for yourself
