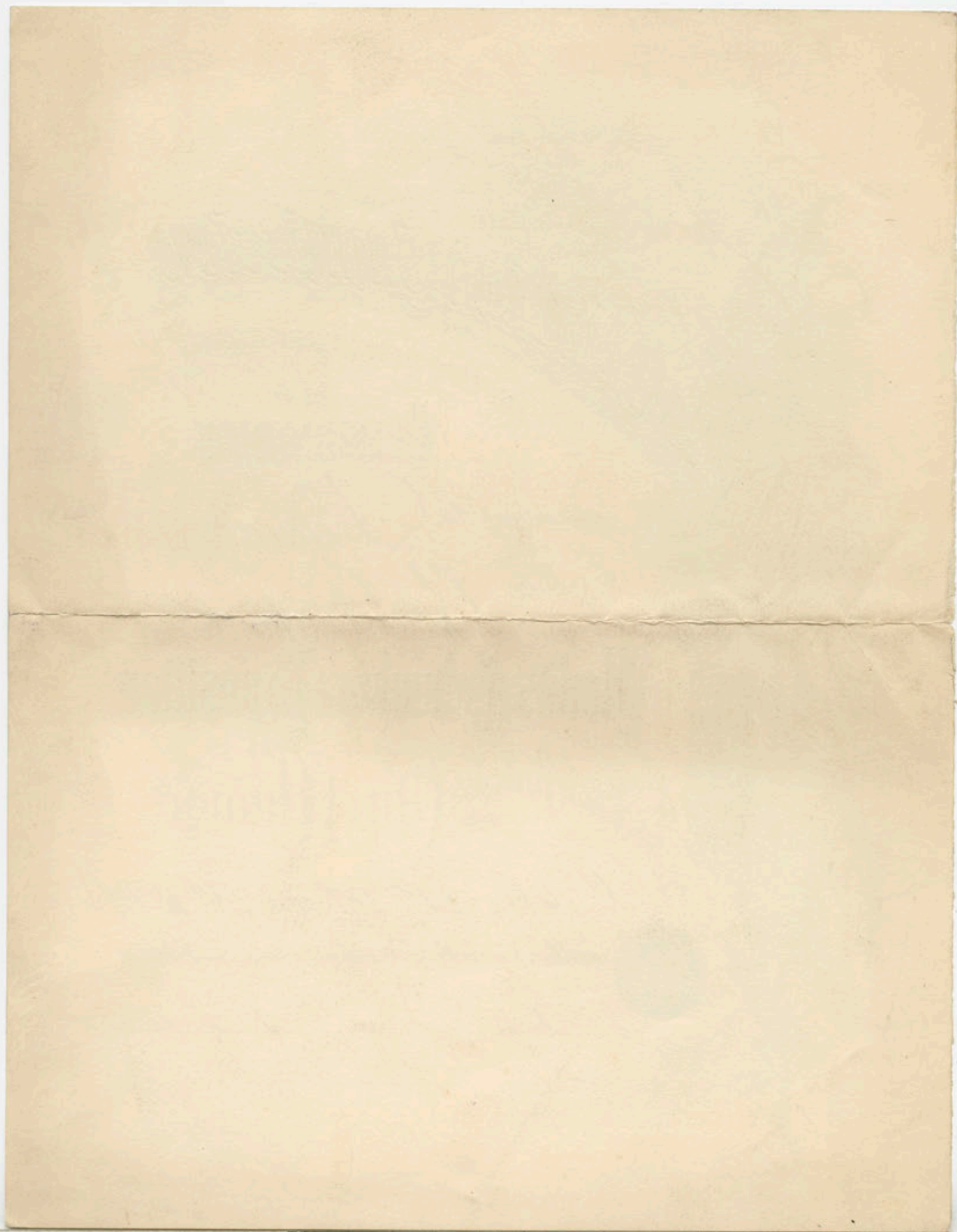

Manufactures and Liberal Arts Building in which the Dedication  
Ceremonies will be held at half past twelve in the afternoon.*
