My dear Mr. Graves:

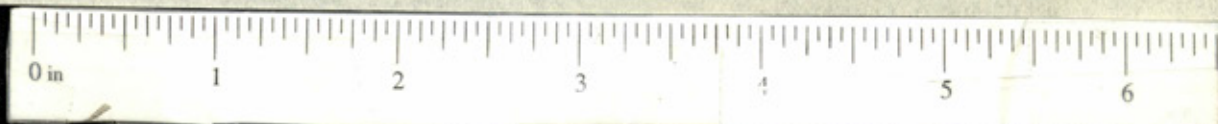
