The act in question prescribes that officers, on the corps establishment, with the rank of Sient. Colonel, shall be assigned from the army or volunteer force by the President. Hence it will be seen that

should Mayor Howard's resignation as auce-de-Camp, be accepted he would cease to be an officer in the service and would thereby become legally incapable of holding the position of assistant Inspector General by assignment. 


