

The army and Navy Journal demands the exposure of his infamous treaty, and comments severly spore any policy that will allow each a completely and.





Teste Commissiones & C; General; have the honor to acknowledge receipt of your com munication of the 15th inst, Enclosing your cheek for \$ 80/25/100, being amon due James Robbins, late put Co. C. 10. W.S. 6. Troops. With reference to your protest against the action requiring

you to pay over this money, you are respectfully informed that the state ment of this case, as set forth in your communication, is not in a coordance with the facts, which may be succinctly stated as follows: The money was received To pay this claim out - Vouchers for

the disbursement were rendered to the Treasury Department; the disterrsement was not in fact made, the money having been deducted from the funds held for payment of these claims - it was not, at the time the transfer was made, turned over to this office, Investigation disclosed the Gact that you, as a Disbursing Offices, did receive the same, but failed to either charge yourself with it, or to account for it to the Treasurer of the U.S. - that you did use it to make up your indebtedness to the Tovernment when the transfer was made to Major J.M. Brown, and therefore, in fact, did not transfer to him all the public funds for which you were a countable. Your action in transferring the amount mow, balances the account so far as is known.
