

Be it known that I, Harry J. Kellogg, a citizen of the United States, residing at South Bend, in the county of St. Joseph and State of Indiana, am the designer and sole proprietor of a painting which I have named "The Siege of Chattanooga." The subject of this painting is located in and about Chattanooga, Tennesse, and represents Chattanooga as it appeared in 1861, 1862 and 1863, including the topography of all that portion of country represented within the circle and four points of the compass as shown by the accompanying sketch or map, which by reference will be found to contain all places of interest, and engagements of the union army, with the rebel forces, at the date given above. The painting also represents the battles of Lookout Mountain and Missionary Ridge, giving a bird's eye view of all the forts, namely, Fort Wood, Fort Negley, Fort Cameron, Fort Bragg, Fort Buckner and Breckenridge, also the winding of the Tennessee river, Orchard Knob, Pine Ridge, Lookout Valley, Chattanooga Valley, Lookout Mountain, Raccoon Mountain, Sand Mountain, Moccasin Point, Hill City, Waldron's Ridge, Tunnel Hill, Missionary Ridge, Chickamauga Valley, Chattanooga Creek, Brown's Ferry and Pontoon Bridges, Wauhatchie and Rossville, The painting also gives the positions of Generals Hooker, Thomas, Sherman and Bragg's command or army. 


