it, which are characteristic.

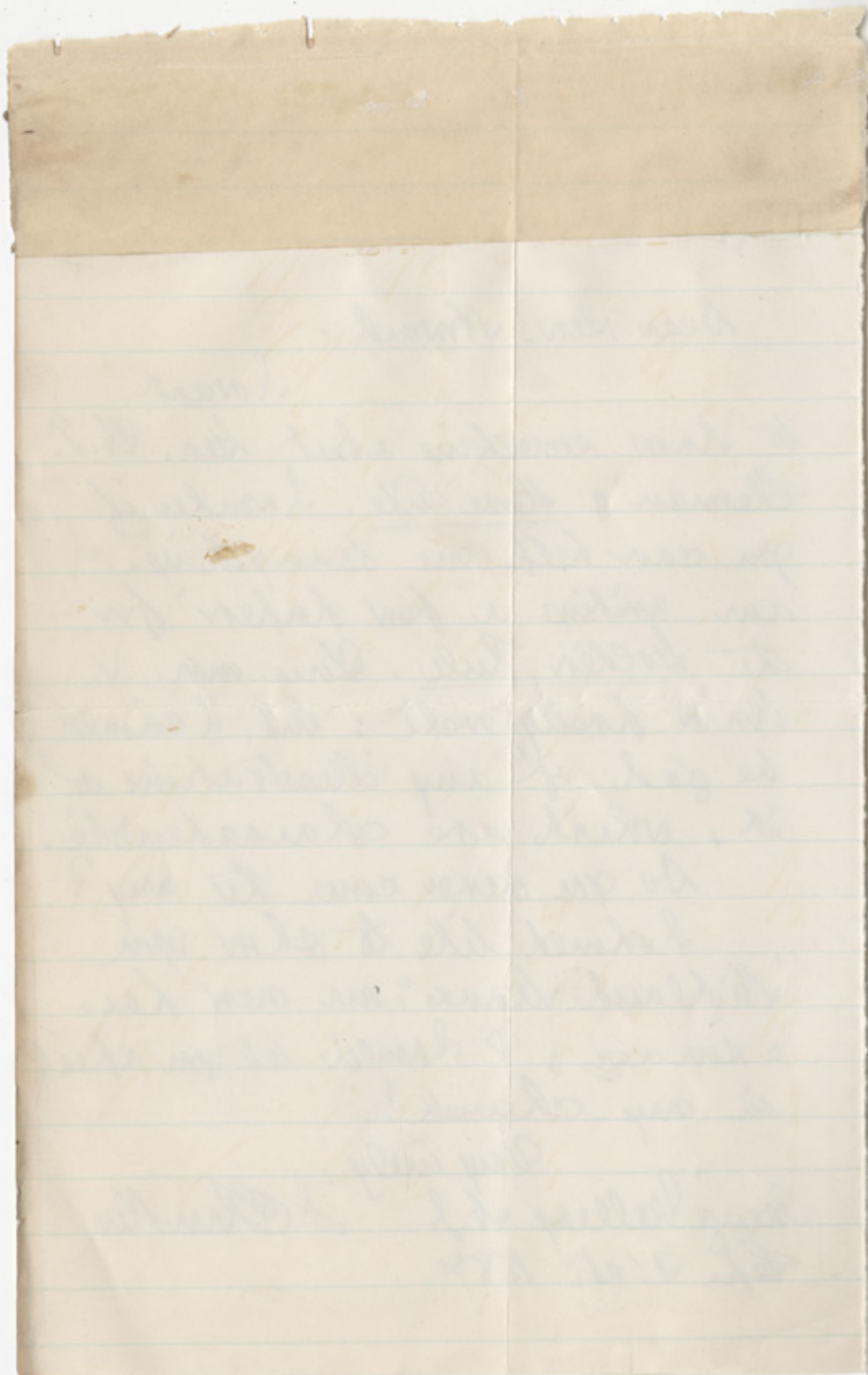
