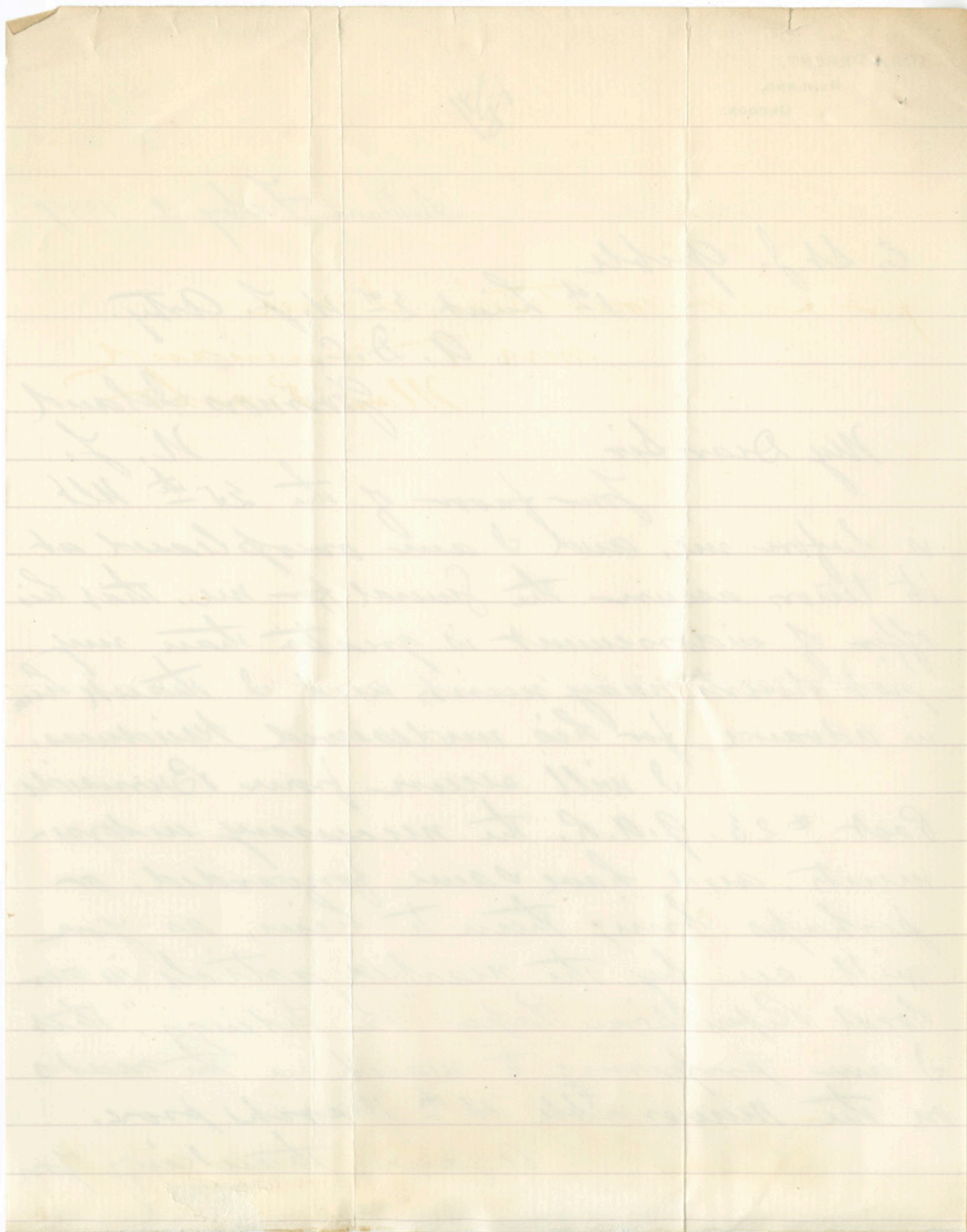

My dear General:

Yours of the 18th ult. was duly recd. There is a Bill before the Legislature at Sacramento recommending that the price of School Lands be raised from \$1.25 to \$5 per acre; and the probability is the Bill will become a law. Now Mrs. Howard has but 24 days more before her location expires, and I would advise you to pay \$5 down to the State and secure the land. To make such payment a total of about \$200 would be required. To "prove up" the affidavits of two witnesses as to the character of the land will be required. These affidavits will cost me ten dollars, and if you advise me to that effect I will procure them at that figure. If no
