## To the Friends of the Saboath:

Rev. Wilbur F. Crafts, our Field Secretary, has returned from a lecture trip in the South and West, to his home, 74 East goth Street, N. Y., only to plan for a more extended lecture tour which is to include all of the States and Territories (except some of those just visited), with a view to organize as many of them as possible into State and Territorial Sabbath Associations before next Winter's session of Congress. He will speak in the double interest of his two specialties, Sabbath observance and Sabbath-schools. March will be mostly spent in New York, with a week out, commencing March Ioth, for helping in the fight for Sabbath rest at Cincinnati, and an address on the 25 th in connection with Joseph Cook's lecture at Boston, just before and after which, and also before and after an address on April 15th to the Worcester Congregational Club there will be opportunity for addresses in other New England towns, where the way may be open.

This also goes toward paying the cost of the trip and of documents to give away at Sabbath observance meetings.

Will any person in any of the places named, who may receive this slip, see the pastors or other friends of Sabbath rest with reference to holding a meeting in his town on the date indicated and on the conditions named, and at once report the result to Rev. Wilbur F. Crafts, 74 East goth Street, by letter or telegraph.

Whenever it is possible it is hoped that the pastors of some one of the cities visited in each State or Territory (except those already organized for the defense of the Sabbath), will call the friends of the Sabbath together from all parts of the State or Territory for the purpose of organizing a State or Territorial Sabbath Association. This was success fully done not long since by the pastors of Columbus, Ohio When this is not feasible let there be a local mass meeting or sermons in several leading churches, in case the appointment is for a Sabbath. If even this is not feasible, please let it be known to Mr. Crafts at the earliest possible moment that the date may be used for some other place in the same region.

Dear Sir:
I have the honor to inform you that I shall assume the Superintendency of the above-named Academy at the opening of the School year in September next, and beg permission to place your name in the list of references which will be published in the Register of the Academy, which will go to press in April or May. I shall give my personal attention to the School, and shall be supported by a strong faculty, four members of which have already been selected, all men of successful experience in the work of discipline and instruction.

The Academy will occupy the beautiful buildings and grounds of the Glen Ridge Hotel, at Cornwall-on-the-Hudson, of which I enclose piclures. The buildings are fitted with all modern improvements -gas, water works, water-closets, with ample water supply, bath rooms, etc., all heated by steam. The changes which we contemplate will make the Academic building one of the most complete and convenient school edifices in the United States, and will provide commodious class and lecture rooms, laboratories, drawing and work rooms, a reading room, library and gymnasium. On the south building is an Observatory, which will be provided with a seven-foot Astronomical Telescope upon an equatorial stand. The grounds, twenty-nine acres in extent, are beautiful, elevated, and highly cultivated, with well-kept lawns, and gravel walks leading to rustic seats that commend a magnificent prospet of river and mountain. The location, four miles above West Point, is healthful, beautiful and accessible.

The buildings are handsomely furnished and will be very fully equipped. Each Cadet may have a room alone.
