In conformity to higher emanation of
patriotic impulses, and, in generous obedience
to the concluding paragraph of your Sep 13-1889,
letter, from "Headquarters Division of the Pacific,"
I scribe this letter to you, because we are friends
in good words and fellow-servants of patriots.

That letter was your last one to me, and its
concluding paragraph was this: "Hoping that
this letter will not discourage you from doing
us an occasional kindness, I remain very truly
Yours. - O. O. Howard, Major Genl U. S. A."

- I have no further preliminary. -

The only peace Chief of the Wmatachee died. He
was buried last Sunday, Sep 8. His name was
"Kuck-tas-keh," his wife was one of Chief Moses'
people, and desired his death for betrayal of
Indian prestige and prerogatives. He was
deserted by his own tribal friends for his silly
collaboring with their enemies, and for misrep-
resenting to the white squatters the true and
unflinching patriotism of the Columbian Chief
Moses - or Suck-tash-kosom - whose life is in
constant jeopardy from prejudiced times.

"Hon. Milt" - a self-made-Italian priest constituted
Sovereign-Chief of a very mischievous and low
order, will now assume dictum, and be a
"Chieftain-militant general" over ignorance and
superstition among Indians, Esquimaux and
Christian Indians. He and the entire bands are
picking holes on the Puget Sound reserve lands,
where they must annually the "King George
tribes" - all antagonistic to the "George Washington
Indians" - as unpatrioticism represented by the
"Old Chief Moses" - father of the present Moses;
who made war on the "King George Crowns."

You know that "Chief Moses" father was, in
"trachon, killed by the Crowns, his arms cut off,
his legs, feet and his head cut off, and carried
"to the British Agency in British Columbia" - a
fact, that Chief Moses and his people constantly

men, women and children, by compelling
them to sign a treaty they had no part and

All through the Indian tribes of entire America
this dividing line is ineffaceably drawn, to wit:

"Our homelands and that of our fathers
"are ours by inheritance, and not subject
"to disposal by treaties through the Indian and
"White men's Chiefs - by paper law not of abo-
"riginal making or of Indian and White
"American citizens approval. No government
"on Earth has the right to compel any of its
"people to sell or give away their homes and
"father's lands of their fathers. No goodly true
"man ever gave or sold away his children's
"homelands; more especially so, since all
"Indians were made and still are - "wards of
"the United States" - by their own consent and
"for their own protection and preservation;
"Therefore, "wards" cannot make a treaty
"with their Guardian government agents
"for the paper promise of pay for lands
"and reservations they were forced to go
"upon, after their original homelands
"were stolen from them by invasion and
"pre-purposed warfare. To deal away
"that which was given us for our posterity
"cannot have the approval of our children;
"hence, their disapproval will anger our
"offspring, and bring reproach upon us.
"Indians always know the Earth was
"made for man - not man for the Earth.
"Man is only a tenant at-will on a
"Creator's Domain."

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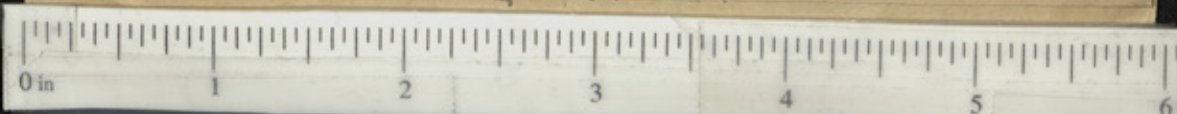
"Whenever our Indian forefathers allowed
"their chiefs to sell, or trade away their lands
"for the "Chief's bribe money"; first and foremost
"came upon those lands in the third genera-
"tion thereafter, a century of wrong-doing
"being tributary in blood and fire for the
"improvements of the Indian Race, by the
"inactments of a God-less Constitution, that
"fastened Slavery on thirteen States, that
"originally fought as Colonies - for seven years,
"to be "Free and Independent States"; and
"Appealed - in a Declaration of Independence
"to a "Creator", "God", "Divine Providence",
"and "Supreme Judge of the World" - for the
"rectitude of their intentions - to this war
"against a Mother Country - that enslaved
"Colonists of all colors and races - by "Stamp acts",
"excessive taxes", "onrous taxation", and "Sumptuous"
"and legislation" - that deprived farmers and
"Laborers of their homes by judicial opinions
"and paper edicts - based upon prejudice of

It is useless to deny the destruction
going on in Pennsylvania, and General
the "Plover treaty at Long Grove, Wis." and the
recent victims in Iowa, Minnesota and
California. Oklahoma may yet be a job-
Gotha of land decisions, jumps, and
marshals - instituted on a waterless waste
of storm-stricken sections.

Setting fire to dry forests, straining creeks
and rivers for "Company rights" of irrigation
Canals - to further tax impoverished tillers
of the soil - in all our territories, and the
Constant killing of all kinds of birds and
animals for "more sport" may yet fill
the land with drought and pestiferous
insect swarms - that will destroy utterly -
all vital life of vegetation, in all places
affected by wanton waste of wicked man.
The Pharaic past has its counterparts
in the prejudiced present. None of the
Ten Commandments are obeyed by the
tyrannous rulers of any nation; but, as
these are natural laws of Mt. Sinai -
Sun, Air and Stream will enforce them,
despite all our powers - And I bow -
Submissively - to the decree. It is just!

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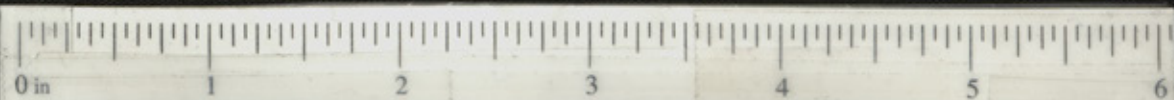
Journal Howard: The Public Land Laws do not operate in the thirteen original States, nor in any State organized in 1850, or before it. Congress had no power under the Constitution to establish Land offices to deprive actual settlers of their home-made-actually-improved-lands; and no power exists in the bill of rights in said Constitution, to establish a "Public Land Department," to ignore private occupancy of lands by pioneer citizens and families of American birth - of their natural inherent rights to homestead and homestead lands only. There was no Secretary of Interior prior to 1850; and no Constitutional provision for such an official misnomer. What is a Secretary of Interior?
