It was understood Col. Hughes desired an assistant and Gen'l. Howard approved it, and Capt. Fessenden's name was submitted to him in advance. But if Col. Hughes prefers to do all the work, it is better to let him do it.

I know of no other duties besides those of inspecting troops and accounts of disbursing officers connected with the Inspector General's Office at Governor's Island, and if Captain Fessenden is not to be permitted to perform his share of these duties, he will, as General Howard remarks, have vertually nothing to do. As Captain Fessenden was detailed as Assistant to the Inspector General Division of the Atlantic, by the Secretary of War, it does not seem a question of Colonel Hughes' preferences in the matter, and I recommend that the Commanding General Division of the Atlantic be authorized to direct Captain Fessenden to perform such share of the inspection duty in the Division as he may deem right and proper. I think any other course would be subversive of Military discipline and tend to discredit the authority of the Division Commander over his staff officers.
