



Fifth—Answered by 100 guns from men-of-war or Forts Canby or Stevens, and by use of telegraphic signals by the steamer whistles and bells throughout the United States.

Sixth—Oration by Professor John Fiske, and poems and literary exercises at the Ross opera house. at 2 P. M.

#### Seventh-Sunset salute of forty-four guns.

Eight—Grand marine torchlight procession by steamers, tugs and fishing boats in front of city of Astoria, to start at 7:30 P. M., returning to wharves at 9:30 P. M.




