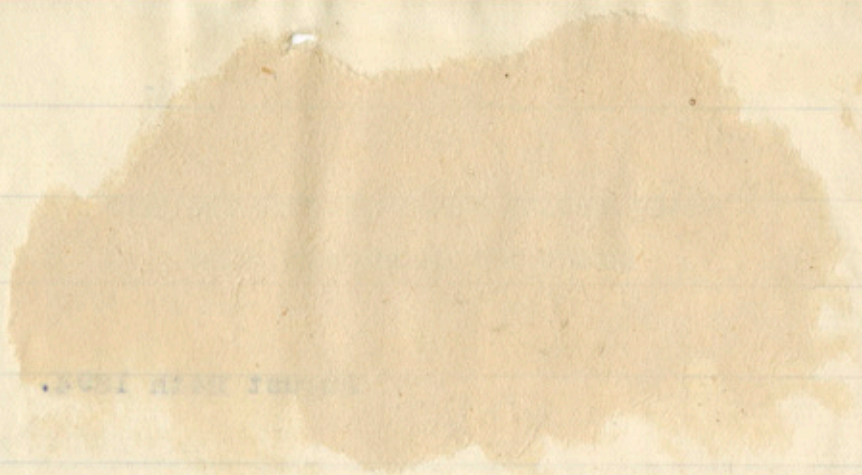

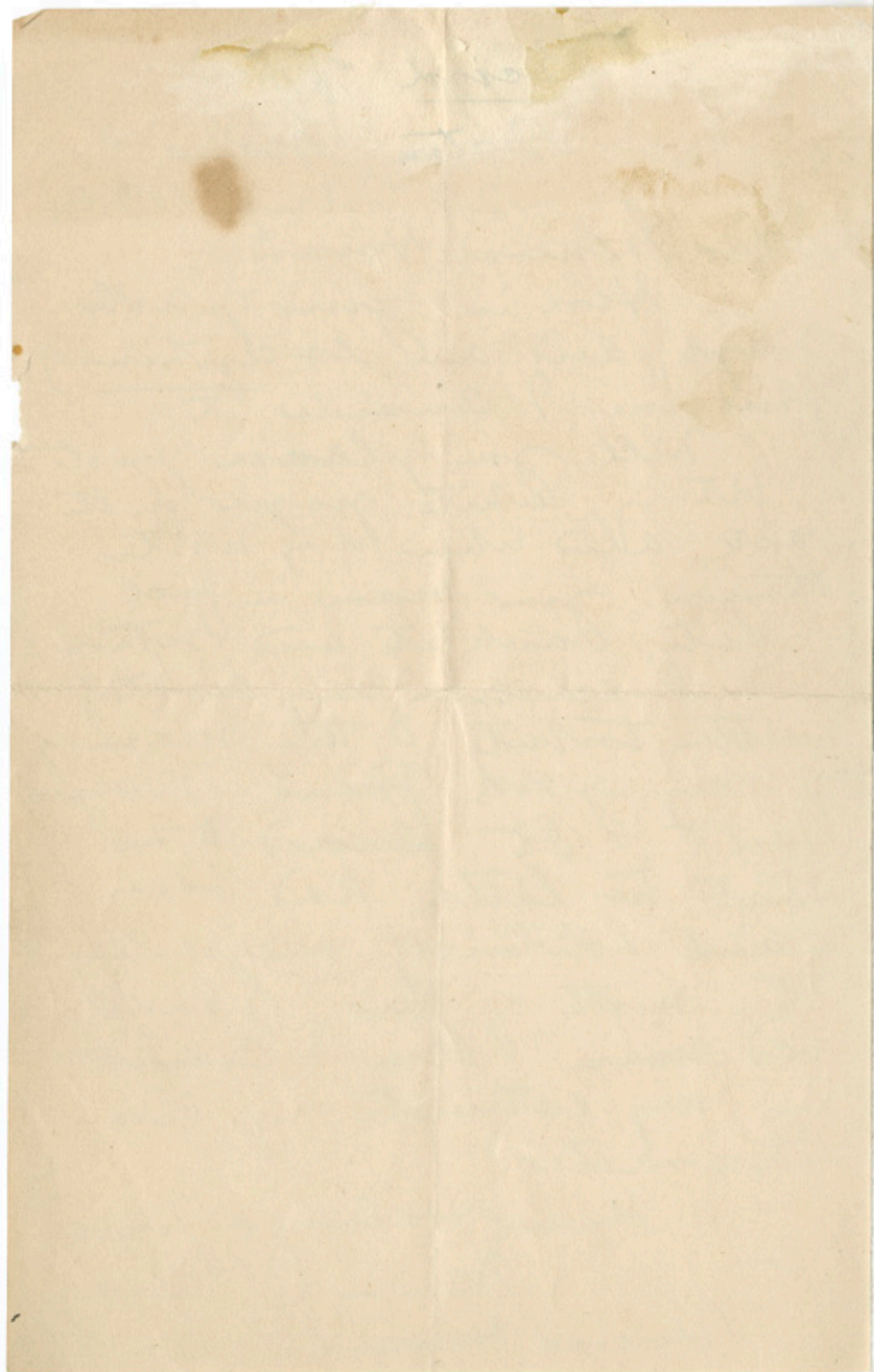

Dear General and brother  
I write you  
about a matter which, while it does  
not come within your province  
directly: still I am in hopes  
that being in the interest of our  
common Lord and Master you  
may find it within your power  
to help consummate the plan which  
I have in mind.

Fort Schuyler (on Progg's neck)  
has within it upwards of 100 men  
or soldiers (I believe about 115).

These with their families are  
wholly without religious instruction  
unless they walk  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles to  
Westwater village (there is no

public conveyance)

The Colonel and Chaplain is willing and anxious to have his men under some religious influence (although I believe not a Christian)

Some friends in Williamsbridge (about 6 miles from the fort) have for the past four or five weeks held a religious meeting (of an evangelistic character) in the fort every Thursday evening with very interesting results. As many as five soldiers have, by standing, signified their desire to enlist under the banner of our Savior.

The meetings have been well attended (from 80 to 100 being present every meeting) and while we have no musical instrument the singing has been an attractive feature.

We have been able to secure the services (gratefully) of a Minister of the Gospel each meeting and propose to continue them as long as the interest keeps up; but it has seemed to us that if services could be held on a Sunday (as church service and also one as a Sunday School for the children) that much more good could be accomplished. This we are not able to do as most Ministers and also Church Members are busy in their own fields on Sunday.

I would like to find out from you if there is any way whereby an appropriation for the support of a chaplain (or other minister) either wholly or partially can be obtained. It has seemed to me that our Government should be directly interested in the spiritual welfare of its soldiers - at

any rate to bring some means to  
that end within their reach.

There is a plan on foot among  
us at Gilliesbridge to get up an  
entertainment to raise money for  
a musical instrument for them  
(either a piano or organ) whether it  
will mature I cannot say.

The friends from Gilliesbridge who  
go over to the meetings number from 15-6 24  
every meeting and are warmly inter-  
ested in the work - we have to drive  
over as there is no other way of getting  
there.

Can you point us in the way of  
an appropriation as above suggested  
or in any way help in this matter?

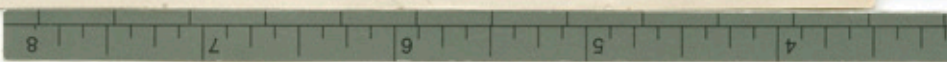
