

Sir:

Referring to the letter of General C.H.Howard, dated the 23rd ultimo, which you requested to be placed with the application presented by you for the award of a medal of honor to Captain Joseph A.Sladen, U.S.A., (retired), late of the Thirty-third Massachusetts Infantry, I have the honor to inform you that the Assistant Secretary of War, to whom the papers in the case were submitted, has this day returned them to this office with the following indorsement:

"The facts in this case are not sufficient to justify the award of a Congressional medal of honor, although highly creditable to Captain Sladen. It should be noted that no mention of this distinguished gallantry was made at the time, either in orders or in any report of the battle."
