I have asked the publishers to forward to you a copy of a work entitled "The Church in America and its Baptisms of Fire; being an Account of the Progress of Religion in America, in the Eighteenth and Nineteenth Centuries, as seen in the Great Revivals in the Christian Church and in the Growth and Work of various Religious Bodies."

The volume is illustrated with fine Portraits of the Great Religious Leaders and Revivalists of the two Centuries, in order to make the Ministry and the Laity more familiar with these men and their work, and thereby to rouse them to a sense of the need of like awakenings in our day, and to lead them to turn their attention and energies to bringing them about.

The book as a whole ought to be the very best hand-book on Revival Preaching, Revival Methods, and methods of effective Christian Work.






