I think Wheaten may get it as a reward for long and faithful service, but he goes out in about five weeks after kRuger, so will not interfere with those who are left. I have longer service than any of them, and twelve years longer than Brookeor Otis, and had a higher command than any of them during the mar, and I do not see any reason why I should not resent my claims for consideration to the authorities.

If you are not in favor of sone other brigadier for the place, and have no objections to advocating aye elains, I wish you would give me a letter to the incoming Sec. of tar that I can file with my other recommendations. I have very strong Army recommendations on file nom, and think I have the necessary political influence to have then brought to the attention of the President and Secretary. I should like very ouch to have a letter from you, if you feel inclined to give it, but if you do not wish to endorse me, please do the me the favor to write to ae and say so, that I gay know how I stand in regard to recommendations from you. .

We are having delightful weather, and have had all winter.I think this climate preferable to New England's in the winter. The members of the class of '54 are fast dropping out, and after April next there Will be but Sawtelle and myself left. Tempus Fugit.
