My dear General: -

I write to you confidentially, to learn if you would feel inclined to help me to obtain the appointment of Major General on Ruger's retirement. From what I hear I judge that all the Brigadiers are working for it, and I do not know that any of them are more entitled to it than I am. I think Wheaton may get it as a reward for long and faithful service, but he goes out in about five weeks after Ruger, so will not interfere with those who are left. I have longer service than any of them, and twelve years longer than Brookeor Otis, and had a higher command than any of them during the war, and I do not see any reason why I should not present my claims for consideration to the authorities.

If you are not in favor of some other brigadier for the place, and have no objections to advocating mirelaims, I wish you would give me a letter to the incoming Sec. of War that I can file with my other recommendations. I have very strong Army recommendations on file now, and think I have the necessary political influence to have them brought to the attention of the President and Secretary. I should like very much to have a letter from you, if you feel inclined to give it, but if you do not wish to endorse me, please do th me the favor to write to me and say so, that I may know how I stand in regard to recommendations from you. .






