





Dear General: to do it with, perhaps you can raise it for taxes or sell land. I have seen Mr. Bartarlach (the principal mortgage holder and ditto note of Company with yourvendorsement) several times the last few weeks since his arrival from France. I then wrote to Mr. Elliott, Wimwell's deputy, for the tax receipts, etc., as he is more friendly and disinterested; he writes Mr. Wimbwell is out of town and on his return he will ask him to send the amount of taxes, so there is some hope; however, this Bartarlach now comes out and says if he buys tax titles and with overdue mortgage, he does not intend to pay Company one cent for the land. As you may remember, I am authorized to sell it for one dollar per acre by resolution of board. This would leave about a thousand dollars over for company. Tax titles reed. 25% bonus on capital paid for taxes and the cost of sale and advertising must be added. Mr. Wombwell offers to reduce the State taxes and costs 40% for two years, '93 and '94, which he can do; but not the last two, according to the new law, there would be no redemption, but this is not likely to hold as half the State would be forfeited if either would stand and Wimbwell's tax deeds are not worded as if they would hold forever either. Now this land is worth more for turpentining and still more for timber men without mentioning phosphate and Fuller Earth probabilities. I think I can sell it surely this winter for one dollar, if not more and if a friendly person would buy the tax titles, if it still can be done, which I shall know in a few days, he will make 25% per annum sure on his cash invested, and we would realize on mortgage and note about a thousand dollars if not more by themsale of the land. Thus the mortgage and note with your name on it would be liquidated finally, too, and the suit this man instituted dropped.
