




Dear General:





We find that it will be absolutely necessary, as proposed by you some time since, to accept a Deed from the C. I. & C. Co., for the 240 acres of land mortgaged to you in Kern County. In trnasferring this property to you, that Company will trnasfer water rights that have cost them \$10 per acre. We have a proposition from the present tenant on the land to pay \$6 per acre,per year,provid ed you will furnish alfalfa seed and the total expenses of caring for a harvesting the same the first year, on a lease for five years. It is a question for you to decide whether you will accept Deacon's proposition or that of the tenant,which latter is about the customary arrangement for planting alfalfa.

While we have no very great confidence in what Mr. Deacon can do, we think it advisable to accept some such proposition as he makes, unless you have someone on the premises to watch and care for the land cultivated by a tenant.

Messrs. McAfee Brothers, San Francisco, Cal. Dear Sirs:-

In consideration of the fact that the Cal. Investment and Colonization Company of North Vernon, Indiana, owe Gen. 0. 0. Noward about \$4382.04 on mortgage notes of which they assumed the payment in taking a deed for the Fractional S. 1/2 of Sec. 7. T. 31 S., R. 29 E. M. D. M. in Kern County, California and in view of the further fact that the said C. I. & C. Co. have sold off 80 acres of said land to William Brannan and Frederick Huntzicker leaving 240 acres more or less of said half section standing as security to Gen. Howard for the above stated amount, which said Company have notified me that they have informed you as agent for Gen. 0. 0. "oward, that they can not pay, but in lieu thereof, they propose to deed the land over to Gen. Howard to obviate the necessity of your foreclosing on said land, I myself being a member of said company, and having considerable money invested in said property, and being the only member of the C. I. &. C. Co. that is a resident of California, I would like to have a contract from Gen. O. O. Howard for the purchase of said 240 acres of land if you will accept the deed from the C. I. & C. Co. for the same and I therefore give you this proposition to submit to Gen. Howard.

In the first place I will give you asstatement of the condition of said land in regard to State and County taxes, and also water tax(for irrigating purposes.) The taxes on the mortgage interest of 0. 0. Heward for the years 1896, 1897 and 1898 stand against said land inpaid and the land was sold to the State for the taxes of 1894, 1895, 1896 and 1897 and has and will cost in the neighborhoed of \$350.00 to redeem all Then there is due the East Side Canal Company for water for irrigating in 1897, \$375.00 which was due Jany. 1st, 1898 and is unpaid up to this time. There will be due on Jany. 1st, 1899, \$375.00 more for the water of 1898, all water bills must be paid when due or none will be supplied thereafter Now I will undertake and agree to pay up all back taxes on land and mortgagee's interest in said land and redeem it from the sale to the State and shall expect a credit on account to that. extent. I will also pay the water tax of 1897 and that of 1898 we when due and relieve the dand from that lien. I will also pay all State, County and water tax on said land that is or may become due not herein mentioned from this date and thereafter and will pay \$1000.00 Jan. 1,1899,\$1000.00 on Jany. 1st, 1900 and balance of \$2382.04 on Jany. 1st, 1961 with interest on the same from date of contract at the rate of 72 per annum payable annually. I to have the privelege of selling off portions of said land in the parcels of not less than 20 acres to one party and by paying Gen. 
