




My dear sir:

I had the honor of meeting you at Nashville, Tennesse, during the International Christian Endeavor Convention, at our denominational Rally. At that time I had a few minutes conversation regarding our work here. I learn that you are to be in the State at the Michigan Sunday School Convention to be held in the city of Saginaw and therefore venture to write more fully of a matter which lies very near my imheart and which is closely related to the advancement of the Master's Kingdom.

Our little church here was organized five years ago with about forty members. Evo hundred members, most of them on confession, have been received during my pastorate. None of our people are very wealthy. We have about three well-to-do families. The majority are of the working class. We have been worshiping in an old school building which has been for some time and is now increasingly inadequate for our work. It was absolutely necessary to build. Pledges were secured and have been nobly redeemed. The people have done everything they can. This is the testimony of everyone who knows our work. We have been promised a grant of \$1500.00 and a loan of like amount front to prove Source Building Society which shows their conservative belief in the future of this work. We are in a city and in a field where we can be of immense service and if the church is enabled to get in a suitable place to work it will become a great feeder to all our denominational benevolences.

The old mother church here is in debt \$25,000.00. They are not in a position to help us as you can see. But their sympathies are here. <u>What I wish to ask of you is on what terms you would come to lecture for the benefit of the little church at some time near to your engagement at Saginaw ,or some other convenient to you. Our idea is to make a complete canvass of the city, secure its largest auditorium, sell tickets at fifty cents, appeal to the church people who cannot give large sums, and we believe that \$500.00 could be netted for the work. But we need a man of national inflence, like yourself, and preferably a Christian man. I lay the matter on your heart, sir, and beg that you give it serious consideration.</u>
