





They do not wish to see Mr. Summer turned adrift and that is all right. We must get a man to present and get the A.M. A. to agree to work with us when all is ready and then we must turn to the church. - do not know of any better way to work, do you? Rev. George McCollum, the man I am after, is pastor of the Dundee, Ill. Cong. Church. He is a Berea graduate and was settled there as pastor but because Mr, Frost tried to handle him he resigned. He is very successful where he is but I feel sure that he will make a success as a teacher and is strong enough to carry the work at the Gap. He has a common sense piety, too, that is very much needed in such a field. The A.M.A. need just such a man for their work . Our family entertained him here in Providence during the last meeting of the American Board and we were all delighted with him. He also preached for me one evening and his sermon was a very practical one and I do think that he will well fill the double position of pastor and teacher. Even suppose they should not want to make any change at the Gap, there is enough that such a man can do in the region around about. There is need of work at Shawanee, and at Arthur, as well as at Hamilton Springs. He could organize the Christian Boys into squads of workers who could do grand work for the Master all up and down those valleys.
