Dear Harry:

I think you're right about the suggested connection of your father with our Company. I had already made up mind it was not advisable. Now as to the articles, it will answer just as well to have those monographs of the Tribune, which I will personally make extracts from, making up the articles as wanted. I will do it in such a way as will never be any injury, but rather a help to your father's book and to his reputation. It will keep him and his great service to the country before the veterans and tend to increase, rather than diminish, interest in any book that he might publish.

Now as to getting a copy here in Chicago; I think it would be simply inpossible. If you would send me a few of the papers at a time, say half dozen or so, in a registered package, I would preserve them with great care and would have the extract made by type-writer . This seems better than any attempt to have it done by you, does it not? I would return one set and get another in season to prepare the subsequent articles. Dear General Howard:-

With the fall season well under way, I write to ask a renewal of the kindly help you have given us in past years, which you will remember has been \$15.00, or just such an amount as you felt you could give to a work with which you are thoroughly familiar, and which in every department commends itself to you.

The closing year of the century is proving a most eventful one, with war in the Philippines, China and South Africa, with pestilence and famine in India, and every nation of the earth interested in great movements. So, too, in every department of the work of the International Committee, this year is proving a most eventful one, and is clearing the way for a wider and grander work in the opening year of the 20th century.

The most marked growth is in theline of religious work, Bible study, spiritual life, and in personal work for young men. Our four students' summer schools in July were the largest and best student gatherings we have had, and showed the good effect of the evangelistic work in the leading colleges of the country, carried on by our college secretaries and others in the earlier months of the year, in which a large number of students were converted and a much larger number quickened in their Christian life. Three thousand students were converted in our college associations in the past college year.

Early in the year we had the assurance of twenty new railroad association buildings, costing \$225,000, a large part of the money being promised by railway corporations. This is more money for association work from these corporations than the entire cost of the home, foreign and army andnavy departments of the Committee's work for a year.

Our army and navy department has special attractions for you. The war in China, with the movement of troops there, calls for he transfer of most of the work of the army and navy department from Cuba and Porto Rico to the far East. Two secretaries have been assigned to this work in China. Twenty-five secretaries are employed in the army and navy work, and over sixty tons of reading matter, stationery, and other supplies have recently been sent to our soldiers and sailors. This work will call for more than \$40,000 this year.

In view of the large demands of the army and navy, in addition to other departments of the committee's work, I ask as generous a contribution as you can give for this eventful year. I again enclose my subscription book and stamped envelope, asking you to kindly return the book.


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


