





My Dear General :-

I want to thank you for your kind acceptance of my invitation to be at Plymouth church tomorrow evening. And I have thought that it might help you in determining the trend of your talk if I told you a little of our situation.

The Church was nearly smothered by the Expositions for two years.

In addition we had financial burdens which absorbed most of the energies of the members. We have arranged our finances so that they are not so formidable; our prayer meetings have increased in attendance from five to twenty five, and we have received sixteen members since the first of the year, more than had been coming into the church for three years. Now we are looking forward to a series of evangelistic meetings to commence a week from tomorrow, with the assistance of Harold F. Sayles of Chicago. Our people have not been doing much in that way for several years, and we have been trying to kindle an enthusiasm for that kind of work. We need to have the membership see that the religious life is service. There will be those present not Christians, and an appeal to them will do good.


