




By some of the records, of Maryville College, at Maryville, Elount County, Tenn., I see that you contributed a considerable sum to the endowment fund of that institution. It also appears that you made this contribution, upon the express condition, that there should be no discrimination against colored students. The Legislatute of Tenn, recently passed an Act prohibiting the co-education of whites and blacks, in the same institution.

The directors of the Gollege pretend thehave set apart § 16,000, rateber, the interest on \$18,000, for the education of such colored students, as choose to go to a third or fourth rate colored *Mean* school, Regersville, Hawkins County Temm., and maintain that this action on thier part is a full discharge of their duties to the coloredrace under the charter and donations made by you and others.

The colored people, off Marygille, and presolved to assert and maintain their rights in said College, and endowment fund, in the Courts, so far as it is practicable, for them to do so. To this end they have employed me to bring the proper action and to take proper steps in their behalf.
