




Please signify your acceptance of this invitation, that I may hand it to the Program Committee.



My dear General Howard:-I cannot but wish that some official duty or something else would call you to Japan at this time when there seems to be such a spirit of inquiry on the part of the Japanese into Christianity and its demands. There are few men in this country who could go to Japan and make more of an impression on the people than you yourself. The Japanese are hero worshipers; the military officer stands the very highest in their estimate of heroic character. The honorable position which you have long held in the United States Army and this country would give you the widest kind of hearing in Japan; a man of your standing and reputation would carry great weight as a witness for Christianity. I wonder if during the next year or two you will not visit that Sunrise Kingdom and if you do you will not allow our missionaries to make arrangements for you to address companies of English-speaking Japanese at the great centres.
