

I. Captains of Infantry Companies (excepting those now having a surplus) will, on receipt of this circular, make requisition for five (5) pairs trousers and three (3) blouses. Average sizes will be issued, and exchanges permitted between companies of the same regiment.

The field or union of the national flag in use in the army and navy will, on and after July 4, 1890, consist of forty-two white stars, in six rows of seven stars each, in a blue field, arranged in accordance with the diagram in Circular No. 1, A. G. O., Washington, Feb 20, 1890, received at this office.
