Barry Farm.

George F. Marble will hereafter take charge of the Barry Farm account books, having two Blotters and one Ledger for this purpose. One Blotter to be in the hands of M. Fanning and one in his own hands each day for transfer of accounts to the Ledger. The Ledger shall be kept posted and shall be balanced once per week on a given day, say Friday or Monday.

M. F. Fanning will attend to contracts and deeds as heretofore, receiving payments and making full entries upon the Day Book or Blotter.

Luther E. Sligh shall be Superintendent at the Farm, residing there and attending to all the general interests of the people and the enterprise. He will keep a Pass or Check book showing

3. Just how far behind in payments any party is at any time

4. Whether parties have been notified to quit, and when
and all facts and items of information necessary to form
a complete check upon the accounts and books kept in the office
at Bureau Headquarters.

He will also have charge of the matter of notification of parties as to payments due and any decisions that their contracts are forfeited for that or any reasons. McFarming will communicate with Mr. Sligh when necessary on this subject, and all parties holding contracts will be required to pay up arrears while the warm season continues.

Mr. Sligh will see the parties in person and explain and urge the importance of not getting behind in the payments. He will deal kindly and considerately with the freedmen and their families, but be strict in enforcing orders of this Bureau.
