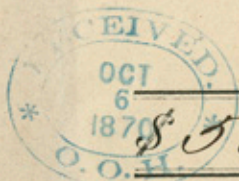

SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING TERMS:

For the accommodation of travellers and others, in emergencies, and incidentally to facilitate its own business, THE WESTERN UNION TELEGRAPH COMPANY will make transfers of money, in small amounts, containing no fractions of a dollar, between a limited number of its offices.

Such transfers will be made upon the following terms and conditions, viz:

To cover clerical and incidental services, a charge will be made of one per cent. on all sums of \$25 or over, and for smaller amounts such charge will be 25 cents in each case.

As the usual telegraphic service necessary for each transfer exceeds two telegrams of 15 words each, a further charge will be made for this service of a sum not exceeding double the tolls on a single message of 15 words between the transfer places.

Payment of the sums transferred will be made at the principal office of the Telegraph Company at the point designated, upon satisfactory evidence of the personal identity of the payee. The sending of a telegram requesting transfer of money to its sender will not be sufficient evidence of his identity with the payee of such transfer.

In case payment is not made to the payee within 48 hours after receipt of the transfer message by the Manager of the paying office (exclusive of Sundays and holidays), the transfer will be cancelled and the amount thereof refunded to the sender on application at the receiving office, and in such case the amount received for services and tolls will be retained by the Telegraph Company.
